"Smartphones increasingly have access to all the data and applications that the corporate PC does. Smartphones left unattended are an easy backdoor for cybercriminals - kind of like putting your valuables in a safe and then leaving a copy in a paper bag in the street. Most smartphone attacks so far are very 1990s and basic, but are thus easily prevented with a few quick, cheap and simple configuration changes. Watch this space though as these devices will change quickly!"
